Persan

Synonymy

In Italy, Persan is officially designated as "Becuet". This synonym is officially recognized in France regarding plant propagation material.

Regulatory data

In France, Persan is officially listed in the "Catalogue of vine varieties" on the A list and classified. This variety is also listed in the catalogue of Italy.

Description elements

The identification is based on:

- the tip of the young shoot with a high density of prostrate hairs,
- the yellow or green young leaves with slightly bronze spots,
- the large, circular or kidney-shaped, dark green adult leaves, with five lobes, an open petiole sinus, short teeth compared to their width at the base with straight or convex sides, a weak anthocyanin coloration of veins, an involute, sometimes goffered leaf blade, and on the lower side of the leaves, a low density of erect and prostrate hairs,
- the narrow ellipsoid berries.

Cultivation and agronomic skills

Persan is a vigorous variety which is generally pruned long, trained and managed in high growth vine stocks. Good results can be obtained on limestone scree soils.

Susceptibility to Diseases and Pests

Persan is susceptible to downy and powdery mildew.

Clonal selection in France

The only certified Persan clone carries the number 1110. A conservatory of 15 or so clones was planted in 1999 in the wine-growing region of Savoie.

The bunches and berries are small. Persan produces tannic wines, with a good acidity, that are suited for ageing.
