### Origin

Petit Courbu is a native variety from the Pyrénées region.

### Use

Wine grape variety.

### Name of the variety in France

Petit Courbu

### Synonymy

There is no officially recognized synonym in France nor in the other countries of the European Union, for this variety.

### Regulatory data

In France, Petit Courbu is officially listed in the "Catalogue of vine varieties" on the A list and classified. This variety is also listed in the catalogue of Spain.

### **Description elements**

The identification is based on:

- the tip of the young shoot with a very high density of prostrate hairs,
- the reddish young leaves with bronze spots,
- the shoots with tendrils that wind around and cling on to each other,
- the medium, pentagonal adult leaves, with three or five, moderately deep and open upper lateral sinuses, a slightly open petiole sinus or with slightly overlapping lobes, very short teeth compared to their width at the base with convex or straight sides, a strong anthocyanin coloration of veins, a slightly revolute, strongly blistered and almost goffered leaf blade, and on the lower side of the leaves, a medium density of erect hairs and a medium to high density of prostrate hairs,
- the round-shaped berries.

### Cultivation and agronomic skills

This variety is not very productive and is generally pruned long.

### Susceptibility to Diseases and Pests

Petit Courbu is fairly susceptible to grey rot.

### **Clonal selection in France**

The three certified Petit Courbu clones carry the numbers 813, 885 and 1062. Two conservatories of approxymately 190 clones have been splanted; one in the French department of Gers in 1997, and the other in the French department of Pyrénées-Atlantiques in 1999.

#### Phenology

Bud burst: 6 days after Chasselas. Grape variety: late-season, 4 weeks and a half after Chasselas.

### **Technological potential**

The bunches are small and the berries are very small. Petit Courbu produces fine, quality, aromatic wines of great finesse.
