## Cultivation and agronomic skills

Voskeat is a fairly vigorous, late-season variety with a semi-erect bearing. When planted in poor, rocky soil and pruned long, it produces high-quality white wines. This variety is also susceptible to winter frosts.

## Clonal selection in France

There is no certified clone for this variety yet.

## Phenology

Bud burst: same as Chasselas.  
Grape maturity: late-season, 4 weeks after Chasselas.

## Technological potential

Voskeat grape clusters are medium to large, fairly compact, and sometimes winged. The berries are medium-sized, bloomed, with a relatively thin skin. Berries' sugar accumulation potential is high. In its country of origin, this variety is used to produce a wide range of products: base wine for sparkling wine, light wine with high acidity, or mainly fortified wines; it is also locally used as a table grape.

## Susceptibility to Diseases and Pests

Voskeat is very sensitive to downy mildew, powdery mildew, grey rot and grape moths.
